New President of the Board of Directors Selected to Succeed Tim Nelson:

Larry Kugler of Eden Prairie has been appointed President of The Arc Minnesota. Kugler succeeds President Tim Nelson, who died suddenly on Tuesday, August 16, 2011 while vacationing in Colorado with his wife.

“We are grateful that Larry has agreed to lead our organization during this difficult transition,” said Pat Mellenthin, The Arc Minnesota’s Chief Executive Officer. “Tim Nelson was a superb leader for The Arc Minnesota and an exceptional human being. As our president, he helped strengthen The Arc Minnesota, and he committed his presidency to increasing the unity of The Arc organization across Minnesota and the nation. His passing is a huge loss for The Arc Minnesota and The Arc movement, and he will long be remembered for his leadership in the disability community. Larry’s experience and the expertise he has provided our board and the board at our local affiliate, The Arc Greater Twin Cities, are a great reassurance to us that our work will go forward.”

In his acceptance, Kugler said, “I am committed to continuing the priorities that Tim promoted as President. He worked tirelessly for a strong presence of The Arc across the State of Minnesota and to advance the vision that all people with intellectual and developmental disabilities should live lives of dignity and respect.”

Kugler has served on The Arc Minnesota board since 2006. Before his appointment as The Arc Minnesota President, Kugler served as Treasurer and then as First Vice President. He chairs the agency’s Public Policy Committee; serves on its Finance Committee; and is a strong advocate for improved public policies at the county, state, and federal level for people with disabilities and their families.

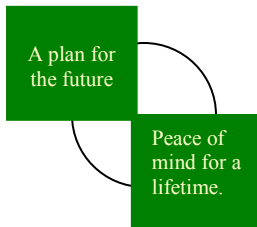
This year, Stephanie won Grand Champion honors at the Olmsted County Fair, and now became the Minnesota State Fair's Grand Champion for her steer, "Keith".

Do I assume my family automatically knows these things?"

August Update

Although we experienced a frantic and rather harsh budgeting legislative session, we are pleased that our state has decided to continue providing support to Region 10 and our unique Quality Assurance, Improvement and Management System that utilizes the **VOICE** Review. With our continuance of funding set for the next two fiscal years, we are currently working out the usual contract details with DHS and the Counties. Currently we have two counties, Houston and Olmsted, which have decided to return to Region 10 QA for licensing their providers. Recently we have received word from Fillmore County that they are not renewing their agreement at this time. However, new language in the legislation may allow providers that are providing services outside of those counties to opt in as well. This is our interpretation of the legislation – we are working on confirming this with DHS as well before we move forward in this area.

Another highlight that came from the last legislative session directs DHS to establish a State Quality Council. This Council is to be made up of various stakeholders throughout the state that includes people with disabilities, family, advocate, provider, county and state. In the formative years – Region 10 Stakeholders must have at least three members. We are hopeful that this Council will be able to take all the information generated over the years from DHS work groups, Region 10 results, other national quality initiatives and determine how to move forward with a Quality Management System for our state.

This Council's charge is to:

- Assist DHS in fulfilling federally mandated quality improvement and assurance for disability services.
- Establish Regional Quality Councils.
- Establish state quality improvement priorities and activities.
- Approve and direct implementation of a community-based, person – directed system.
- Recommend feasible and stable funding for the system.
- Approve measurable outcomes.
- Establish variable license periods up to three years.
- Design a transition plan with Region 10 QA Commission by July 1, 2013

Region 10 QA Commission News

We are very grateful that we have a strong Commission to work with this busy year. With a new fiscal year, our Region 10 QA Commission has undergone some changes in leadership. Our newly elected officers are LeAnn Bieber (chair), Jill Draayer (vice chair), Melissa Evans (treasurer) and Laurie Sutherland (secretary).

We are happy to welcome four new Members onto the Commission – Josh Burt, Mary Pieper, Ryan Stack, and Cheryl Whitesitt. A big thank you goes to departing Members - John Jordan, Hulet Sherry, Tonya Williamson, Roy Harley, and Barbara Zoelle-Johnson. We will miss their commitment and enthusiasm on the Commission.

Staffing Update

During the past year, we had one staff working 30 hours per week to coordinate the community volunteer efforts of Region 10 Quality Assurance. Since no **VOICE** Reviews were conducted during our non-funded year and our system is set up to have continuous reviews throughout the cycle of a license, we were required to “play catch up” this past year. We have made strides in getting caught up – but are not there yet. It is our hope that by the end of the year we will see all licenses caught up in their **VOICE** Review and QARC cycles.

To aid in this progress, we are currently in the process of adding a 20-hour a week Quality Assurance Manager. Working together with the Director, we hope this staff will allow us to increase our support to the counties, providers, Commission and QATs as well as be active again on a statewide level.
